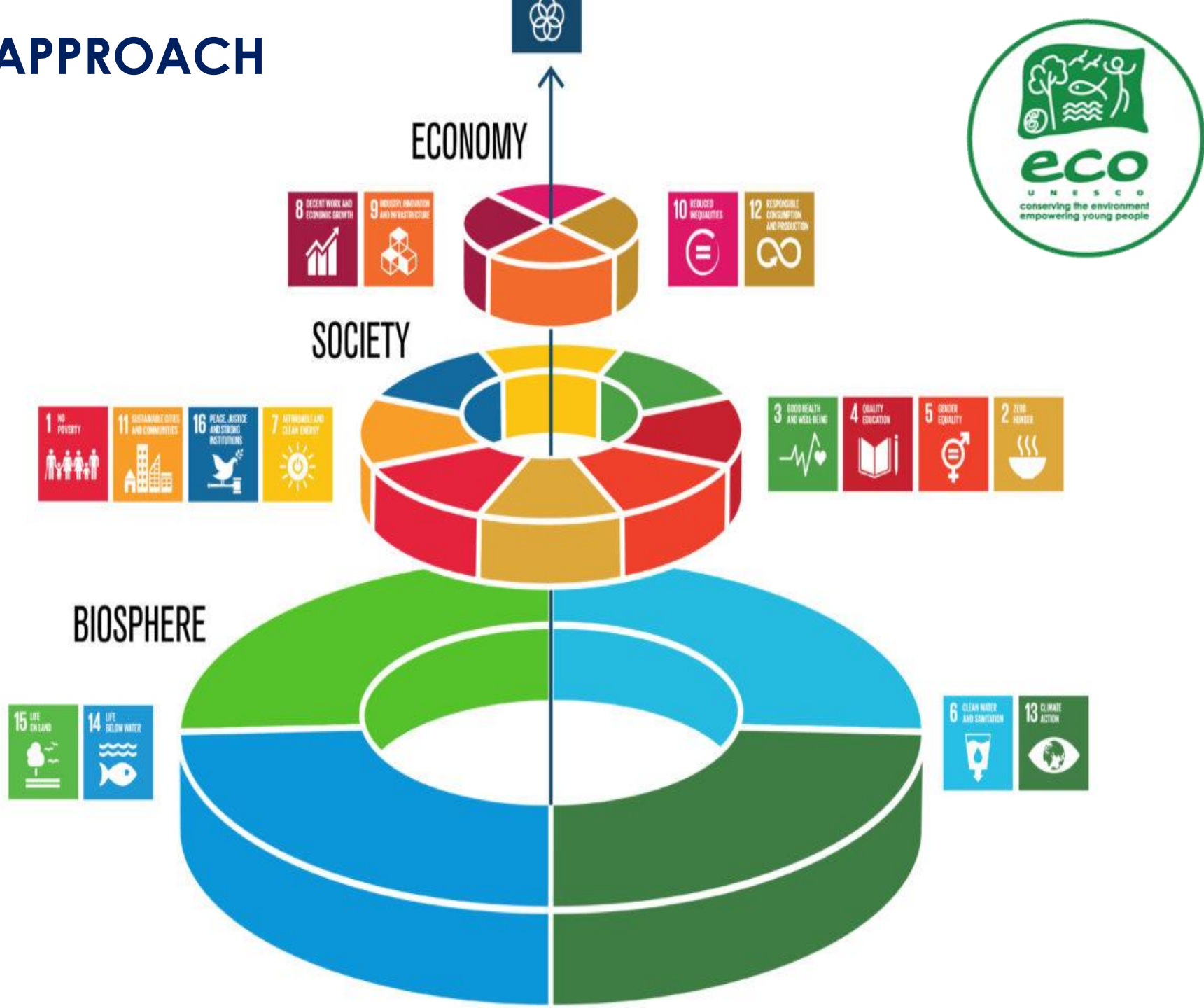

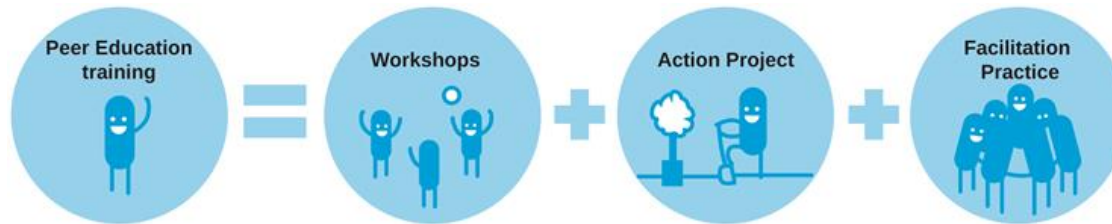

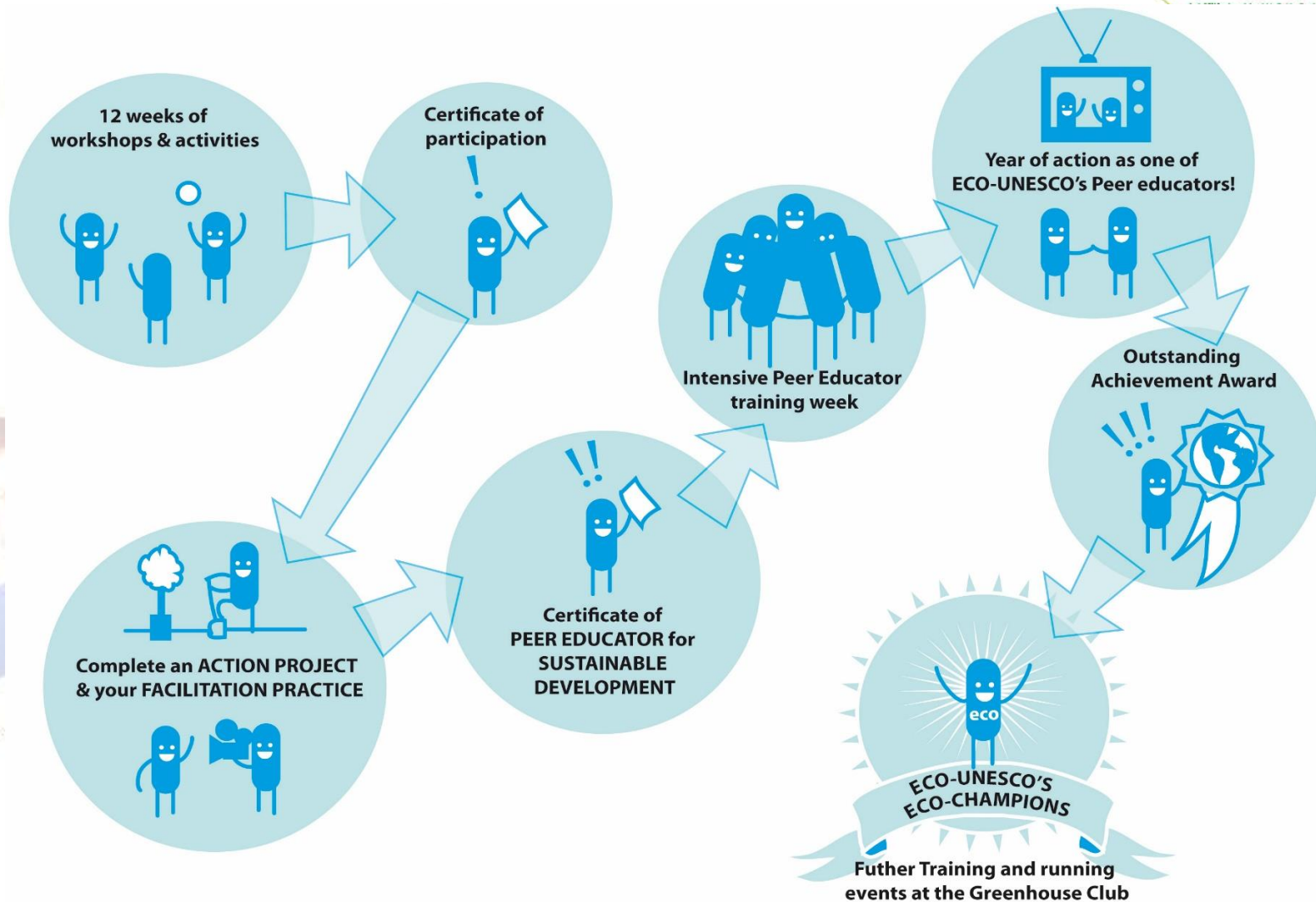
Youth for Sustainable Development (YSD)

Progression Path

Facilitates Peer Educators through a flexible, needs-driven training process



Action Project – Sample - Leap 2 the Future

Young people wanted to tackle climate change on a local level by reducing emissions

Young people were largely excluded from the Dublin bike sharing scheme (Ireland)

Followed 6 steps framework and carried out a project

Included meeting with local TDs and Councillors, and the Dublin Lord Mayor to propose their idea of linking the Leap Card to the scheme

the Leap Card was linked with the Dublin bikes scheme

Age Groups: Senior: 15-18 Junior: 12-14 Super Junior: 10-12



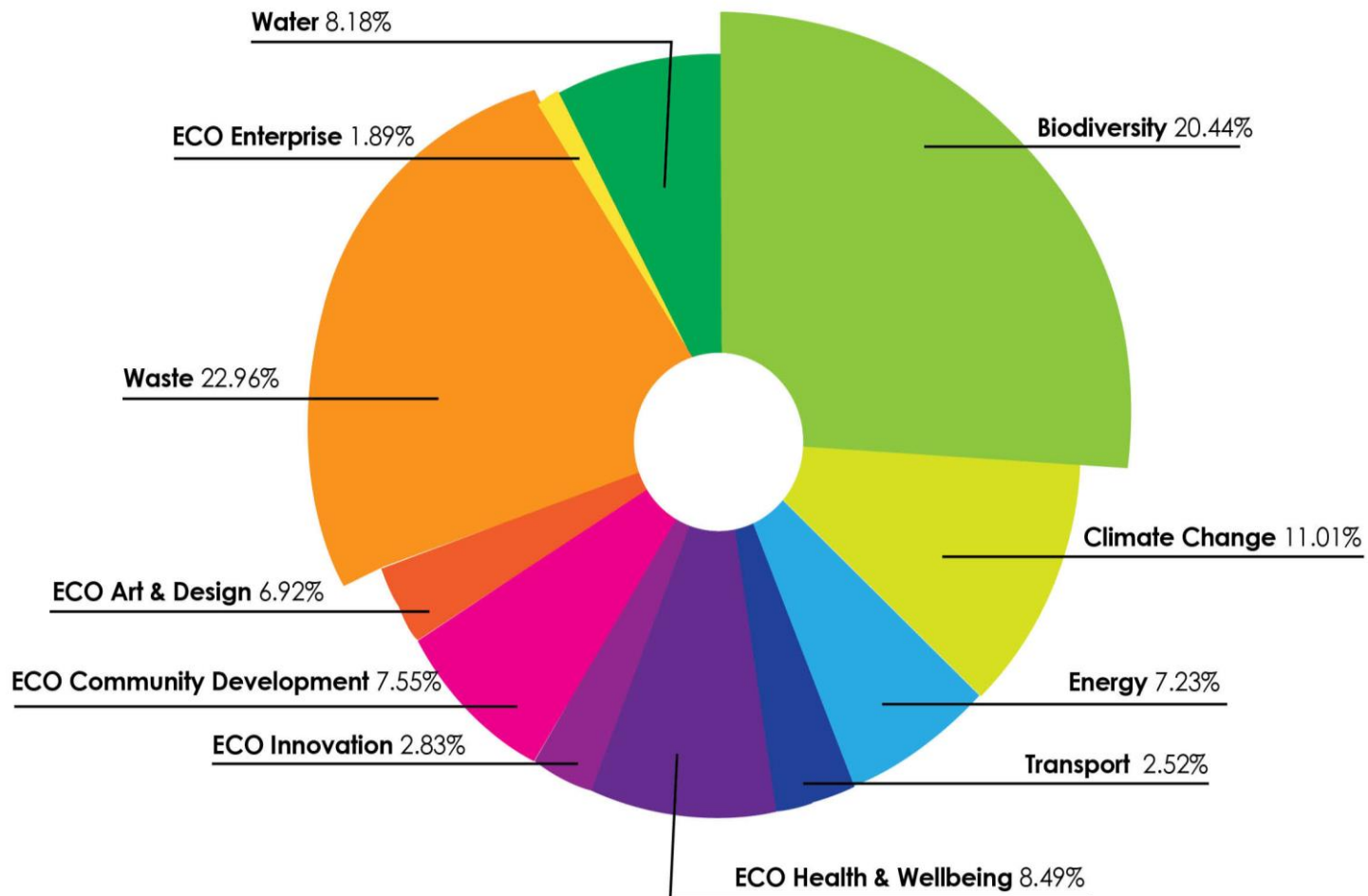


ESD Promoted through YEA Action Projects

- **Knowledge:** Sustainable Development, Citizenship, Participation

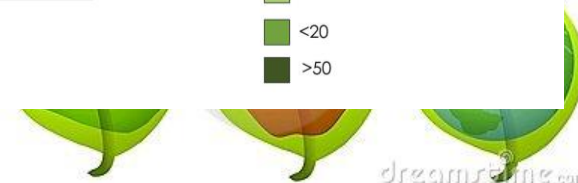
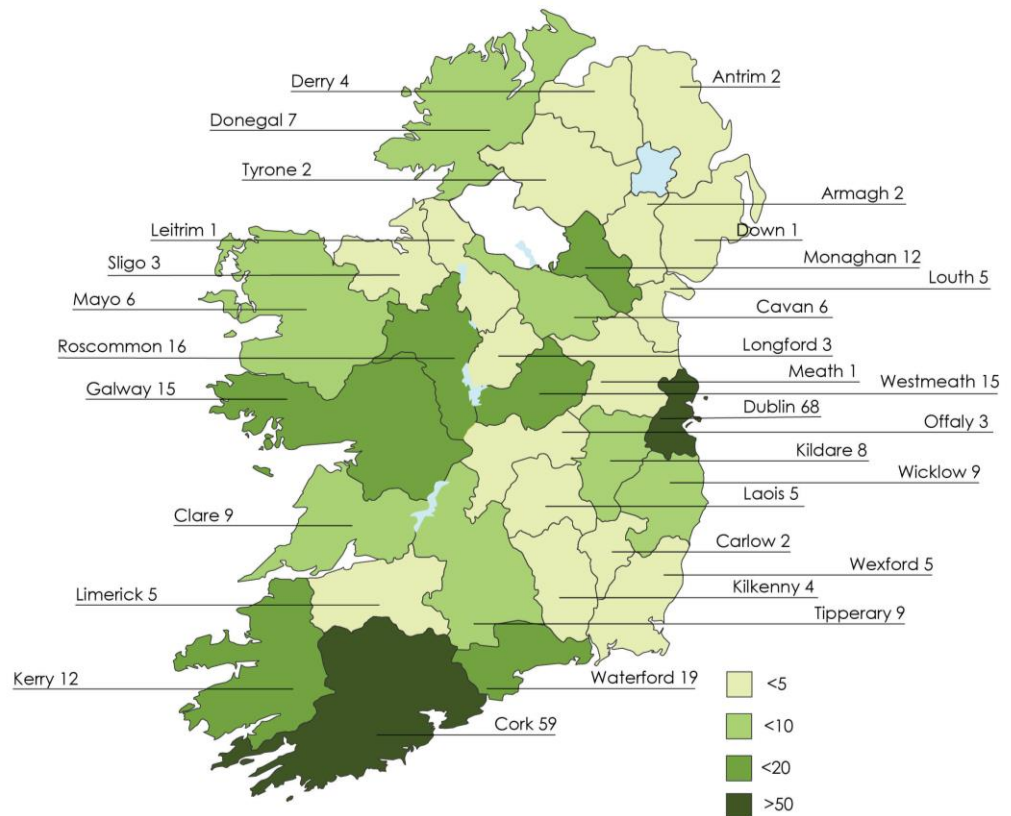

YEA 6 Steps Framework & Phases

- Step 1. Get a team together
- Step 2. Select an environmental issue
- Step 3. Develop an action plan
- Step 4. Take action
- Step 5. Raise awareness
- Step 6. Reflect

Internationally UNESCO is leading on ESD

Currently through Global Action Plan (runs to end of 2020) has two objectives

- to reorient education and learning so that everyone has the opportunity to acquire the knowledge, skills, values and attitudes that empower them to contribute to sustainable development and make a difference;***
- to strengthen education and learning in all agendas, programmes and activities that promote sustainable development***

To enable strategic focus and foster stakeholder commitment, the GAP has identified five priority act areas to advance the ESD agenda.

1 Advancing policy: Mainstream ESD into **both education and sustainable development policies**, to create an enabling environment for ESD and to bring about systemic change

2. Transforming learning and training environments: Integrate sustainability principles into education and training settings

3. Building capacities of educators and trainers: Increase the capacities of educators and trainers to more effectively deliver ESD

4. Empowering and mobilizing youth: Multiply ESD actions among youth

5. Accelerating sustainable solutions at local level: At community level, scale up ESD programmes and multi-stakeholder ESD networks
