What is Geoweeek?

Geography is the study of places and the relationships between people and their environments. Geographers explore both the physical properties of Earth's surface and the human societies spread across it. They also examine how human culture interacts with the natural environment and the way locations and places can have an impact on people. Geoweeek raises awareness of the importance of Geography as a discipline from an educational and public policy perspective.

Map-making competition

For this year's Geoweeek competition we are asking people to make an A3 map of their favourite park. The map can be at any scale and how you define your 'park' is up to you to decide. You can check out last year's entries on our website

Maps **must have a title** and **must identify at least 5 key features** of the park. They will be judged on originality, design, clarity of information and presentation. We would encourage you to use any type of material you like as long as it is **NOT** computer generated.

A selection of maps will be also be chosen for display at the annual Conference of Irish Geographers which will take place Cork in May 2017.
- Maps must be A3 size and not computer-generated using any technology.
